THE GREENBACK FALLACY.

One hundred and fifty years ago John Law organized the most stupendous scheme for making everybody rich by the issue of a baseless paper currency, that was ever conceived.

He issued millions of paper currency, based upon the future appreciation in value of lands in some unexplored and almost unknown country.

Law's money was worthless, credit he had none; his lands were a myth, and he fled the country to escape an arrest for a debt of \$5,000,000.

The present greenback scheme is only a repetition of the history of the financial scheme of John Law. Let every honest man beware of all such foolish, wild and dishonest financial delusions.
