

Gas Light or Electric Light.

The gas companies and their expert advisers declare that they are not at all afraid that there is any prospect of the substitution of electric light for gas light.

The Franklin Institute of Philadelphia, according to a speaker at a recent meeting of the American Gas Light Association after expending money in experiments with the electric light, failed to discover in it any elements of practicability.

Meanwhile, however, remarks the New York Sun, here, in Canada, and in England gas stocks have declined heavily, and they obstinately refuse to rebound.

But can the electric light be profitably used for the illumination of large open spaces has been proved beyond question.
