Our Treaties With China.

The first treaty entered into between the United States and China was made in 1844 and guaranteed protection to all American citizens in all parts of China and promised the support of the military in enforcing this treaty.

At length in 1868 Anson Burlingame, who had been sent to China as Minister for the United States, deserted the service of his country and accepted the position as the Ambassador for the Chinese government.

Articles VI of that most unfortunate treaty declares: "Citizens of the United States visiting or residing in China shall enjoy the same privileges, immunities, or exemptions in respect to travel or residence, as may there be enjoyed by the citizens or subjects of the most favored nation; and, reciprocally, Chinese subjects visiting or residing in the United States shall enjoy the same privileges, immunities and exemptions in respect to travel or residence as may there be enjoyed by the citizens or subjects of the most favored nation."

States' Rights and Immigration

Before a Territory can be admitted as a State of the Federal Union, Congress must pass upon the Constitution adopted and ratified by its own people, for State establishment, and unless the instrument conforms to the Constitution of the United States, it must be amended or altered to that imperative requirement.
