It was bitter cold from Buffalo to St. Louis on the 3d.
Fever has broken out among the English in Afghanistan.
Emperor William, of Prussia, is slowly gaining health.
Caret Cashling died on the night of the 2d at Newburyport, Mass.
The Fitz John Porter case was reopened at West Point on the 3d.
The coming elections do not endanger the present French cabinet.
The Second Baptist Church was destroyed by fire at St. Louis on the 3d.
Charles Francis Adams, Jr., has resigned as government director of the Union Pacific Railroad Company.
Scarlet fever is decimating miners at Silver Lake in Lake Superior. Sixteen out of 160 have died in a week.
It is expected that the Secretary of the Treasury will issue another call for redemption of \$10,000,000 5-20 bonds, consols of 1867.

The excitement from the discovery of wire gold on Olvera street, Los Angeles has not subsided yet, and prospectors are still staking out claims.
A 38 ton gun burst at Lemid during practice on the British man of war Thunderer. The vessel's turret was destroyed, seven men killed and 40 wounded.
Noah Williams and Madoc Gainey, two burglars were shot at Oaktown, Indiana, on the 3d by citizens in ambush. Williams was killed and Gainey fatally wounded.
News from Kabul is to the effect that Yakoub Khan required his officers and soldiers to swear on the Koran as their general declined to become security for their fidelity.

It is reported that the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Co. has purchased the Denver & South Park railroad and agreed to complete it to Leadville by the 1st of August next.
At a cabinet meeting on the 3d it was decided that the Secretary of State open negotiations with the Chinese government for a modification of the Burlingame treaty, with a view to restricting Chinese immigration.

A committee of six were appointed by the Pacific Stock Exchange to investigate and suggest measures whereby the institution may become independent of the San Francisco board in regard to business quotations.

Edward Salvary, proprietor of a saloon at the corner of Merchant street and Dunbar alley, San Francisco, killed himself in a house of prostitution on Morton street on the 3d, by shooting. Whisky was the cause. He was a native of Virginia.

The number of miles of railroad constructed in the United States last year exceed by 2,688 miles any previous year since 1873. Minnesota, Iowa, Missouri, Colorado and Kansas made the greatest progress in railroad building.

In elections for members of the folketing in Copenhagen the moderate left lost 14 seats, of which the right gained 7. The radical left lost 6 seats to the right, and the latter lost 2 seats. The radical leader Touber has been defeated.

At a convention of branches for the election of State officers in Maine, the nominees for the Democratic Greenback caucus were elected as follows: Secretary of State, Edward H. Gove; State Treasurer, Chas. A. White; Attorney General, Wm. A. McClellan; Adjutant General, Samuel D. Levitt.

The Greco Turkish frontier commissioners will carry on their negotiations at Athens. The Greek vizier states that he respects the principle of rectification of the frontier upon the condition of Turkey retaining strategic line and the powers engaging to observe neutrality in the event of Greece raising any further claims or attempting invasion.
