Political Black-Mailing in Washington.

An undiscovered clerk in the Treasury Department has given to one of the papers in Washington information which will cost him his place if John Sherman can discover his identity. He writes: "There was never such a comprehensive system of political black-mailing as is at present being levied upon Department clerks. In the Treasury Department John Sherman headed the paper with \$100. The chiefs of Bureaus contributed \$50. The clerks will average from \$10 to \$20. In the Treasury proper there are about three thousand persons employed. Blackford, the one-armed man, who formerly occupied the position of Captain of Police at the Capitol, is the one who has charge of the official black-mailing. Ever since there was such an outcry against the removal of Blackford at the Capitol on account of his being a Union soldier he has been employed to do the dirty work of the Republican Congressional Committee. This Committee is not in a very harmonious condition, owing to the feeling of its members against their stupid, blundering Chairman; but John Sherman directs them, and that fact has temporarily allayed the discontent. Every dollar collected from the Departments is railroaded into Ohio."

Read in the light of Hayes' celebrated Civil Service Order, July, 1877, forbidding the contribution of money by officers in any of the Federal Departments for political purposes, and commanding them to abstain from active participation in partisan matters, under penalty of dismissal from office, the above revelation of the situation at Washington is very interesting. To carry Ohio for Foster this year is the "big boom" to the scheme to give John Sherman the nomination for the Presidency next year. Hence, the clerks must contribute largely or lose their places. It is Civil Service Reform.

The House.

We have heard the question asked frequently within the last few days as to what change in the House of Representatives the recent election in California would effect. The Forty-six Congress is now complete with the exception of two members from districts where vacancies have been created by death. One of these districts is in New York and the other in Texas. Presuming that the Republicans will elect the member from New York and the Democrats the one from Texas and counting the four Republican members that have been elected in California the House will stand; Democrats 148, Republican 135, Greenbackers 10. The Democrats have therefore a clear majority over the Republicans and Greenbackers combined, and on questions of national politics this will be further increased as the majority of the Greenback members are antecedently Democrats.

Elections.

The Republicans have elected their entire State ticket in California. They have also elected all four of the Congressmen. Killoch is elected Mayor of San Francisco by the Workingmen who also elect the majority of their candidates in the city and county of San Francisco.

The election in Maine on last Monday will require the official count to decide the result. The laws of that State requires that the successful candidates must have a majority of all the votes cast otherwise the election for State officers is thrown into the Senate of the State. The Republicans will have almost, if not a majority, over the Democrats and Greenbackers combined.

Mr. John Sherman says that no Democrats will be turned out of the Treasury Department, and gives as one of the reasons that there are no Democrats employed there. The employees of that Department, the Banger Commercial asserts, are largely made up of those who helped steal the Presidency for Hayes.

A Government ship, the Springfield Republican thinks, is not the right sort of vessel for Presidential candidates to take, whether it is Grant on the Richmond in the waters of Japan or John Sherman on a revenue cutter on the coast of Maine.

The Dubuque Telegraph says: Republican professions of sympathy and love for soldiers have proven unreliable. Their inconsistency in this respect is in keeping with their usual acts.

The American Minister to England, unless he is an experienced poker player, finds it difficult, the Chicago Tribune alleges, to meet the expenses of his establishment. Mr. Schenck always made the Britons foot the bills.

The fact that every Democrat candidate for the Presidency since 1864 has been a New York man, has already, the Boston Transcript asserts, been made the theme of frequent grumbling.

The New York Sun says: We should prefer the election of Sherman to that of Grant because we believe the election of any man to a first term is to be preferred to the election of any other man to a third term.

The exigencies of the Republican party have been such, during the past three years, the Detroit Free Press declares, as to require the manufacture of the large stock of fictitious outrages at the South, and the people have naturally become chary of accepting them.


