Mr. Tilden's Claim to the Presidency.

An eminent statesman in Maryland has thus written in reference to Mr. Tilden: "His conduct during the Electoral controversy was calmly dignified and patriotic. He advised Congress to adhere strictly to the Constitution and not deviate an inch from its plain provisions. The whole controversy was in the hands of Congress. Mr. Tilden was an outsider, and had no more power or control in the matter than had your humble correspondent, and it would have been very indelicate and indiscreet for him to have assumed a position that, though it was given him by the people, was not ratified by Congress according to the Constitution.

"So far from his being at fault in this matter, he is the one who has suffered the greatest wrong; and instead of rejecting him for their own fault, the Democratic party are in honor bound to make the only reparation now in their power by putting him again in the field as their standard-bearer in 1880. There is, in all justice, but one contingency in which they can refuse this reparation and stand acquitted before the American people and in foro conscientie; it is an honest conviction on the part of the Democratic Nominating Convention, from previous State elections and other circumstances, that Mr. Tilden cannot be elected. Success is the great, paramount consideration that should override all others. Nothing personal should be allowed to stand in the way of it. Our highest obligation is to the country. While as an individual I might prefer Bayard or Hendricks, or perhaps with more certainty of success, David Davis, still I can see no reason why, if nominated, Mr. Tilden should not be cordially supported by every good, honest Democrat North and South. He is a man of rare ability, a conscientious reformer, largely endowed with the spirit of government, and has proved himself a conservative patriot under circumstances of trial to which no other American citizen has ever been subjected."

Congress Complete.

The roll of the popular branch of Congress is now complete. Waldo Hutchins, Democrat, was elected from a district in New York at the recent election to fill a vacancy caused by death. The Democrats now have, in the house of Representatives, a clear majority of three votes over Republicans, Greenbackers, and shades of political ideas. It is thought that the meagre vote cast by the Greenback party, in recent elections, will force Greenback members to choose sides with more or less positiveness between old parties. Should it happen that such members would go back to former party ties, the Democratic majority would be increased to eleven.

Interest on overdue Notes.

An interesting decision in relation to overdue notes, and the rate of interest they shall bear, has been decided by the Supreme Court of the United States. The Court holds that where a note bearing an agreed rate of interest is not paid at maturity, it must thereafter draw only legal interest until paid, unless there is a stipulation otherwise.

There is trouble among the Radicals from the Western and Northwestern States over the recommendation of Hayes to retire greenbacks and stop silver coinage. It is altogether in favor of the National Banks, and calculated to push on Sherman's "boom" for the Presidency.

Horatio Seymour Jr. was elected in New York, by a majority of 14,000. Horatio Seymour Sr. has never failed to carry that state by a round majority. His name is a tower of strength in York State.

The steamer saloon at The Dalles was burglarized on Thursday evening and the burglar got a dollar and ten cents for his trouble.

Good News for Oregon.

NEW YORK, Dec. 10.—It is officially announced this afternoon that the Oregon railway and navigation company have purchased steel rails, locomotives and equipment for 200 miles of standard gauge railroad, to be constructed in eastern Oregon and Washington territory during the year 1880. Fifteen hundred tons of the rails are now on board the ship Orient, soon to sail from Cardiff for Portland. One hundred miles will be built from The Dalles up the Columbia river to connect with the existing Walls Walla railroad; fifty miles more will be an extension of the latter to Snake river, and the remainder will connect Texas ferry, on Snake river, with the heart of the Palouse country. It is stated that these extensions and new constructions are made for the purpose of opening up, in conjunction with the Northern Pacific, the great grain producing district of eastern Washington territory. The line of the Northern Pacific in this region extends from the mouth of Snake river north-eastwardly to the Bitter Root mountains, a distance of 200 miles.

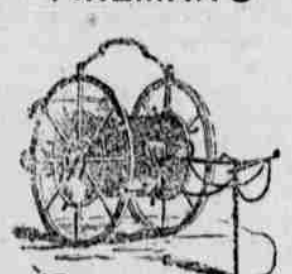
