In too Much of a Hurry.

The Indianapolis Mail, a Radical paper, thinks the Radicals of Indiana should not be in too much of a hurry to crowd the State with Southern negroes. Says the Mail: It is fair to assume that the negro laborers of the South are as well paid as the average laborer of the North. They receive food, clothing and shelter. Does the average Northern laborer receive more? In thousands of instances it is shown that the Southern farm hand is able to save money and purchase land. Is this true of the Northern farm laborer? It will be seen by a close examination of the subject that the negro in the South is getting along, all things considered, quite as well, if not better, than the farm workers of Indiana, and that the thousands of them should be induced to come to this state to embark and improve their lives as farm hands cannot be defended upon any principle of justice to either party or either section. It is not philanthropic for neither party is benefited. It is not in consonance with political economy, for it is not calculated to advance the general welfare; and since the exodus movement is not philanthropic nor economic, those engaged in carrying it out should be persuaded to desist.

The Republican leaders in Indiana are, however, the Louisville Courier Journal asserts, determined to import, at a great expense, enough negroes to carry the State next year. The programme will no longer be popular, and the result of such importation will not be good for the Republican party, upon whom the responsibility will rest.
