Democratic State Convention.

A Democratic State Convention is hereby called to meet at Albany, on Wednesday, April 7, at 1 o'clock P. M., for the purpose of nominating a candidate for Congress, three candidates for Supreme Judges, Judges for each of the several judicial districts and Prosecuting Attorneys, and the election of six delegates to attend the National Democratic Convention, and to transact such other business as may properly come before the Convention.

It is recommended that no person cast more than two votes, either by proxy or otherwise, at said Convention, and a full representation be most earnestly requested.

The Maine Muddle.

The situation in Maine, as we learn from the latest dispatches, is not materially changed. Gov. Garcelon's term having expired, and trouble being anticipated, Maj. Gen. Chamberlain issued an order stating that he would assume control of, and protect all state property.

Obituary.

LONG TOM, Lane Co., Or., Dec. 22, 1879. ERROR GUARD—We are again called upon to chronicle the death of another one of Oregon's early, noble, and energetic pioneers that of Benjamin Richardson.

Benjamin Richardson was born in Kentucky, November 25, 1796. In the year 1803, his father, Daniel Richardson, moved with his family to Missouri, and in 1805 removed back to Kentucky, and in 1806 returned with his family and settled on the extreme frontier of Missouri in what is since Franklin county.

In the Spring of 1846, Benjamin with his brother Aaron (Duck), Clayton, Rollin Hinton, Thompson Hinton, and Zebebe Shelton, father of Dr. T. W. Shelton, and their families, set out for Oregon, in the far northwest. Upon arriving in the Willamette Valley, Benjamin first settled in Yamhill county. In 1847, he moved, and resided in Polk county one year. In 1848, he moved and settled permanently on the Long Tom, in what is since Lane county, his house being then the farthest south of any settler in the territory, where he resided up to the time of his death, 31 years.

He was known for his industry, and many kind and commendable acts through life. In his every day life he was affable, amiable and genial; charitable and benevolent to the helpless and destitute; social and outspoken with his friends, and those with whom he associated; prejudiced against those guilty of deception; prompt in all business obligations, his word was his bond; he was true and grateful towards his friends and held their presence and name in kind remembrance.
