Honorable Democratic Honors.

The Democratic candidates for Presidential electors of Indiana met at Fort Wayne last Friday to discuss the causes of the Democratic defeat, and it was agreed to press upon the attention of the American people, first: a constitutional amendment to have the popular vote elect.

Second—Election of U. S. Senators by the people instead of the Legislatures.

Third—Review of the present unjust and discriminating tariff by capable men.

Fourth—Vigorous opposition to the introduction of Chinese cheap labor in order to preserve the dignity of intelligent labor.

Fifth—Taxation of greenbacks.

Sixth—No coercion by an office holding public.

Seventh—Simultaneous elections all over the country in November.

Eighth—A Democratic Congress caused the prosperity now existing.

Ninth—Demand that the alleged frauds in New York be investigated in order that if Garfield is elected by fraud that Hancock may be installed.

Blunders.

Through the failure of the Marshal of the Eighth Indiana District to make returns, Gen. Garfield's plurality is cut down to 377. The returns should have all been in Monday, the 23d. It is thought the Marshal was never notified of his appointment. It came near being a tight shave.

At a late hour a change was made in the Republican electoral ticket of the same by withdrawing one elector and substituting another name. In one Republican stronghold the change was overlooked, and the consequence is that Indiana gives one Hancock elector a majority of about 5,000.

Chinese in Nevada.

The Chinese are gradually encroaching upon all the industries of Nevada, says the Carson Appeal. The time is coming when the men who employ Chinese labor will reap the whirlwind. Three thousand Mongolians working at the lake where 2,000 white men once thrived, is a sad thing to contemplate. The wedge has entered the State which will eventually make the home of the white laborer desolate, and times will grow harder and harder.

The wealth of New York City would seem almost fabulous. The valuation of property within her limits exceed that of the combined wealth of 21 States and Territories among which may be mentioned, Maine, Arkansas, Vermont, Delaware, Florida, Kansas, Minnesota, Nebraska, North Carolina and Colorado. Taking the state separately it has more wealth than any state in this union excepting four.

James D. Williams, Governor of Indiana, died at his residence in Indianapolis last Saturday, of inflammation of the bladder. Gov. Williams, more familiarly known as "Old Blue Jeans" was sixty years of age, and had served his state in many responsible positions. He was a member of the state legislature for several terms, was twice elected to Congress and finally Governor.

Senator Slater paid our city a visit this week. The Senator did good work for Hancock in the Presidential campaign, and showed that the Democracy of Oregon were not mistaken in the man when they elected him Senator. He has visited every portion of the state, and returns to Washington prepared to materially assist in procuring favorable legislation for our state.

The tide of immigration from Europe to the United States is flowing strongly. During October 30,699 immigrants landed in New York City, 4,000 arriving in one day. The total number of arrivals at Castle Garden for the year ending the 1st inst., is 285,327 against 112,172 for the corresponding period of last year.

Are the Southern States now in a prosperous condition? We answer by stating that the cotton yield this year will be over 6,000,000 bales, and the export of cotton-seed oil alone will exceed 120,000 barrels.

It seems that the Democrats have elected one Congressman from Iowa—Cook, in the 6th District, who beats M. E. Cutts. So some good can come out of Nazareth, after all.

Untaxed Willows.

Of the eight and a-quarter millions paid out annually for interest on United States 4 per cent bonds, Vanderbilt receives \$1,900,000 on the \$47,500,000 he owes.

He could buy the Fifth Ward, or the Seventh Ward, or the Tenth Ward, Pittsburg, every year and have a handsome balance over. He could trade his bonds off and buy in every iron and steel mill and furnace in the vicinity.

His \$47,520,000 is big enough to scoop in all the coal mines in the country and one-half the farm lands. At \$50 an acre Vanderbilt could buy with this single part of his wealth 950,000,000 acres, or 9,500 farms of 100 acres each. Placing the capital of each farm on the average of \$5,000, Vanderbilt has the bonds 380 of these.

How much labor does each of these 380 farmers perform every year to make \$200 clear of taxes? How much labor and taxes are represented in 9,500 farms at \$5,000 each to make an income over taxes of \$1,900,000 a year? What political party is responsible for the law which have permitted Vanderbilt to become thus wealthy and untaxed? He could not have gained such wealth by honest business enterprises, by fair labor. No, he watered railway stocks, swindled shippers and bona fide stockholders, and law under Republican management permitted him to engage in the wholesale plunder.

Jay Gould, who running a similar kind of business, but does more good on the way, has piled up \$25,000,000 in a few years.—Pittsburg Labor Tribune.

Another Step by the Imperialists.

It appears by the Associated Press dispatches yesterday that the Conspirators are cautiously but insidiously pushing forward their little game. This dispatch informs us that it is said that Governor Cornell in his coming annual message will earnestly second the proposition, that ex-Presidents of the United States shall have seats as Senators-at-Large in the United States Senate, and that Conkling is also said to be unqualifiedly committed to it. It was hardly necessary to have added the last sentence, as Mr. Conkling's imperialism has of late been patent to the world that he would favor any proposition that would concentrate the powers of government in their hands of the party of which he now has the absolute control and also place his silent man in a place where, for the present, he could do the most good. But this is not the only step that is being taken by the Empire propagandists. The Eastern papers are filled with all manner of suggestions and plans about providing pensions for life for ex-Presidents. Of course behind all this is simply a scheme to find some excuse for fixing Grant for life with a princely income at the expense of the public treasury, so that he may be able to continue the style of life we presume he has indulged in for the past four years, till the Imperialists are fully matured. The people still have one friend remaining, and we trust, in the hour of need—his appeal will receive that firm and resolute response that is worthy of the name. That friend is the Democratic Party.—Standard.
