New Bonds.

The Washington correspondent of the Cleveland (Ohio) Herald says that Secretary Sherman in his forthcoming report will admit the practicability of placing an issue of bonds bearing 3.65 per cent interest.

What the Figures Show.

When the census figures began to come from the South it was thought that they were unduly inflated for the purposes of fraud in the Congressional representation.

How very strange that Garfield should prosecute the Morey letter libel case with such extraordinary vigor which whether he wrote or not is no crime, and yet the papers of both parties accused him of receiving \$329 as a bribe in one case and \$5,000 as a bribe in another and not a single one of them prosecuted.

It is said that General Garfield's special escort on Inauguration Day will be the National Tow-path Club, which will appear in line with a genuine canal-boat, mounted and drawn by mules, with a crew in appropriate costume.

How to provide for Weaver will be one of the earliest questions to be considered by the new Administration. He did Garfield all the service he could during the late campaign, and must be held in line for the next.

Governor Foster of Ohio says General Garfield will make no specialty of Civil Service reform in his administration, and will see that all the offices go to the Republicans. Nobody expects anything else.
