The Cost in Time and Money.

An editor of a mathematical turn of mind assumes that 10,000,000 of people have read President Hayes' Message, and that it took each one an hour to get through with it. From this he shows with startling perspicuity and in strict conformity to the multiplication table, that it took 10,000,000 hours to read the Message, 416,666 days, days or to reduce it still further, 1141 years. Mr. Hayes seems to have taken up a great deal of time. He has also caused a very large expenditure of money. If the total cost of telegraphing, printing and publishing that Message by the entire press of the country were invested in United States bonds, the income derivable therefrom would suffice to keep a hundred poor families from want for the rest of their days leaving the principal intact.

Making Too Much Whisky.

The Commissioner of Internal Revenue serves notice upon distillers that they are making too much whisky. On the first day of November, 1880, the amount of whisky on hand was 32,540,000 gallons, an increase since the 1st of July 1879, of 12,400,000. The Commissioner thinks there is an over production, and that the distillers are likely to incur large losses if there should happen to be a reduction of the spirit duties. Moreover as Kansas and Iowa are to be constitutionally prevented from buying whisky, the consumption is likely to fall off. Hence he sounds this note of warning: "It has occurred to me that this business is on the eve of being overdone, and that in the event of a recurrence of the agitation for a reduction of the tax the holders of these spirits would be in danger of loss."

A letter from Wade Hampton is published disclaiming that he intended to challenge Secretary Sherman. This disclaimer from Senator Hampton was published because of a severe letter from a South Carolinian living in California. The letter has resulted in the publication of his letter of self defense. His friends say that he feels keenly the criticism that has been poured out upon him from his own party. While Senator Hampton has been greatly misrepresented, his course during the campaign was not altogether discreet and doubtless lost Hancock and English a number of votes, he being made out a representative of the Southern bugaboo the publican managers aired so freely.

The special vote of Indiana shows that not a vote was cast for every third person in the total population of men, women and children. This is unprecedented in the political history of any state and it was conclusively to what extent colonization was carried out. Missouri, with a much larger population than Indiana, polled nearly 50,000 less votes.

In a recent trial of parties, charged with unlawfully drawing pensions from the Government, in Detroit, it was shown that several colored women in that city had been drawing pensions as widows of soldiers for some years who were the children when the war closed.
