Caught at Ballot-Box Stuffing.

According to such stalwart Senators as Hoar and Dawes the Republicans are blocking legislation and attempting to consummate a bargain with Mahone in the interest of "a free ballot and an honest count." It would seem that the Republican managers in Jersey City are sadly in need of discipline on this point. There was a local election there the other day, and a Democratic candidate for Police Commissioner took it into his head to rise early and inspect the ballot boxes in his ward. The man in charge of them was asleep, so he opened the lid without protest, and found inside a bunch of fifty-one tickets of the straight Republican kind, arranged in such a way that the officer in charge could easily scatter them by inserting his hands in the opening. Realizing that frauds of a wholesale character were contemplated, the Democratic candidate sent for the Chief of Police, and they examined several other boxes, and found the same result of fraudulent arrangement of ballots. The discovery created great excitement and resulted in a Democratic victory. Before lecturing other people, the Republican chiefs should throw their shafts of condemnation at their own party workers, who are adepts in the business of "stuffing." But, then, the chiefs themselves stole the votes of South Carolina, Louisiana and Florida in 1876 and they are, therefore, not likely to be harsh on the sins of their party co-workers, although they are exceedingly Pecksniffian in their denunciations of the peccadilloes of their opponents. If these Jersey City men were tried under United States laws, they would soon be pardoned out of jail by Republicans.

With nearly one hundred and seventy-five millions of gold in the Federal Treasury, with the balance of trade still heavily in our favor and money pouring into the country from Europe by millions weekly, while at the same time British consols bearing three per cent only, and subject to an income tax at that, are selling at par, it would seem that even the dullest intellect in all the land must fully realize the fact that the defeat of the three-per-cent Funding bill through the veto of a fraudulent President, at the instigation of the National Banks and the solicitation of General Garfield, was a gigantic wrong, for which full reparation can never be made, and for which the people will not fail to hold responsible the party which Hayes and Garfield represent, and under whose favoritism the National banks have come to be such a power in the land. In consequence of Hayes's veto, procured by Garfield, the country will lose in interest 16,000,000 a year, or (1,350,000 a month or \$45,000 a day, Sundays included. That is the price the country is paying for the assessment levied on the National Banks in aid of the corruption fund that carried New York and Indiana for Garfield.

As Exposed.

The speeches of Republican as well as Democratic Senators lately have thrown a flood of light on the real motives and policy of the Republican party, and the exhibition is anything but edifying. These motives and this policy had been well guessed at before, but they are now outside the line of conjecture and are well defined and acknowledged. The President took the initiative and declared the Republican policy to be such as laying aside all principle or patriotism, would best conduce to the success of the party. He declared that it should lead the Republicans in the Southern States to combine in a common cause with all the disaffected elements of the Democratic party, no matter what the cause of their displeasure. Ex-Secretary Sherman followed him with the announcement that it was the policy of the party to enter into any coalition or take any means that offered to beat down the Democratic party in the Senate; and Senators Hoar and Dawes, Arcades and the patriotic pair from the Bay State, expressed themselves as ready to coalesce with separatists or readjusters anywhere, or with any other factious split off from the Democratic party, to defeat that party.—Standish.
