Tom Benton's Faith in Himself.

Benton was apparently wrapped up in his own greatness and hardly recognized any of the younger senators. Going up the hill one day to the Capitol, Mr. Cameron overtook the Missouri statesman, and never before having spoken to him, saluted him: "Good morning, Senator."
