

In 1877 the yield of wheat in California was 25,000,000 bushels; in 1878, 37,500,000 bushels; in 1879, 37,300,000 bushels; and in 1881, (estimated) 25,300,000 bushels. During this period the acreage of wheat has been largely increased, principally by irrigation and by reclamation of tule or tide lands. Therefore, the variability of the yield is more notable. The estimate for 1881 may be taken as a nearly accurate approximation, being the result of careful investigation. The Grain Growers' Association of California, from replies to 4,000 circulars recently issued to wheat growers asking information, estimate the yield at 21,450,000. From this the Grangers conclude that they are masters of the situation, and at a meeting held at San Francisco some three weeks since, resolved to hold their stock of wheat at \$1.20 per bushel, or \$2 per cental. The present amount of wheat in California for export, counting old stock and surplus stock of 1880 may be fairly estimated at 60,000,000 bushels.
