A Road Supervisor Explains!

LONG TOM, Oct. 28, 1881.

EDITOR GUARD:—I have been informed by an intelligent and responsible gentleman, that one of the excuses of the County Court, of this county, for levying a twenty mill tax is an anticipated outlay of vast proportions for the "long bridge" across Coyote Creek and bottom, some ten miles west of Eugene City, on the road leading to, or toward, the mouth of the Siuslaw river.

The lumber for the "long bridge," some 100,000 or 110,000 feet, is on the ground and has all been paid for years ago; the flooring is all good and will be for several years, and the expense of constructing and keeping the bridge in repair has fallen upon, and will hereafter rest upon the citizens of two road districts and not upon Lane county.

The bridges under my supervision have an aggregate length of more than 2,200 feet and this year, so far, they have cost the county just thirty-six dollars.

Increased Cost of Living.

The Globe of October 5th says, "The increased cost of living is now a subject of general comment. A visit to market shows that the prices of staple articles are much higher than they were a year ago.

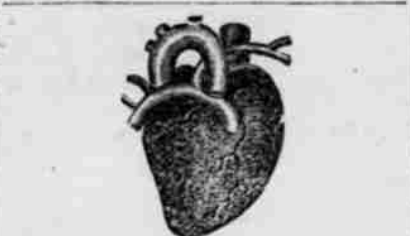

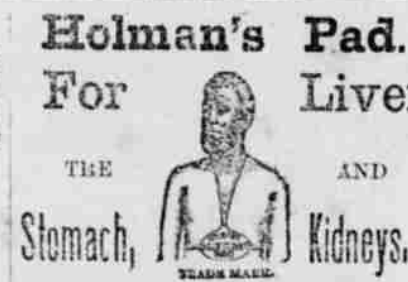
