The Late Elections

We herewith give a summary of the results of the recent elections held in the Eastern States:

Mississippi elects the entire Democratic State ticket by about 30,000 majority.

In Virginia the Republicans and Democrats elect their State ticket by 10,000 majority. The Legislature is also of the same complexion.

New York elects the Republican State ticket, with one exception, by greatly reduced majorities. The Legislature is Democratic, the first time in eight years. This is particularly gratifying as it will re-district the State, thereby insuring a gain of several Democratic Congressmen at the next election.

The Democrats also elects Fowler, Congressman, over Astor, by a large majority, in a heavy Radical district.

In New Jersey the Democrats elects the Legislature.

In the State of Pennsylvania the Republicans elect their State ticket by only 5,000 majority.

Nebraska, as usual, goes Republican, but by reduced majorities.

Wisconsin, which gave Garfield over 31,000, now goes Republican by only 3,000 to 5,000.

The Baltimore American is in favor of increasing the number of the Judges of the United States Supreme Court. On account of the vast accumulation of business now before the Court, it will be necessary to adopt that or some other plan to relieve it from the arrears of undecided cases which are continually increasing. If a reorganization of the Supreme Court does take place, a strong effort should be made to redeem it from the partisan character which robs it of the respect and forbids the confidence of the people. The Court of last resort in the Union should be a forum where political prejudices should never enter, and political exigencies have no weight. Unfortunately, since the Republican manipulation of the Court, those conditions are not believed to have applied.

We never supposed that Brady and his ring of Star route robbers would be convicted any more than were the whiskey ring under Grant. The Republican leaders get up a spasmodic pretense of honesty every little while, but it all passes away into nothing. It would be the very essence of ingratitude for the Republican party to punish the men who furnished the money which paid their election expenses last Fall. They stole it from the people, it is true, but then the Republicans got the use of it.

To note the Republican papers since Arthur became President, it would hardly seem that when they refer to him now, that it is the same man they spoke of when he left Washington for Albany to work for Conkling's re-election. What in the world made him so much better? His power to dispense patronage has made him as good as the saintly Hayes was, according to the subservient Republican organs.

The spectacle witnessed the other day in the United States Senate of "a Confederate Brigadier" leading the Republican side of the Senate to an attack upon a one-legged Union soldier, because he could not, in his conscience, vote for repudiation, will be edifying to the party platform-makers when they reach the "brave soldier" clause of that batch of glittering generalities.

Hancock and Bayard were the favorites with the great assemblage at York town. The former passing from the pavilion, says an exchange, was instantly recognized, and for ten minutes there was a mingling of Northern and Southern shouts of applause. The General, leading his little grandson, blushed like a girl, took off his hat and passed on with bowed head.

There are thirty-one \$5,000 subscriptions to the Mrs. Garfield Fund; three of \$2,500; six of \$2,000; and eighty-seven of \$1,000 each. The smallest subscription is five cents from a poor colored person, and the largest single contributor, hardly any of whom reside in Ohio, and none of whom are stalwart leaders.

Bosses are turning up in many unexpected quarters in the Republican party. Mrs. Morgan wouldn't let the old man accept. In that matter she was a level-headed horse anyhow.

Though Governor Foster's plurality over Bookwalter at the recent election in Ohio was about 24,000, his majority over all was only 1,385.

The Great Eastern Sold.

The Great Eastern, the famous iron steamship, was sold at London the other day for the insignificant sum of \$150,000; and although it is not definitely known what her future employment is to be, it is believed that there is an expectation of being able to render her available for the transatlantic cattle trade during some eight months of the year. It is thought during the four Winter months it would be better to lay her up. She is not a good sea boat, and in any event the percentage of loss in the carrying of live stock in the Winter months is large. The total cost of steamer, including repairs, has been about \$25,000,000, so that the sum she has realized seems paltry in the extreme. The iron of which she is composed must have cost much more money than that now paid for her. She was three years in building, and then three years in being launched and repaired, before she crossed the ocean in 1860. The Great Eastern was the largest vessel ever launched at the time she was built, and that proud distinction she still maintains, as none of the monster vessels built during the last quarter of a century approach her in size. She has a burden of 18,918 tons gross, and engines of 2,600 horse power, which are capable of working up to 11,000 horse-power. Her exact dimensions are: Length, 679 feet 6 inches; breadth of beam, 82 feet 4 inches; depth of hold, 45 feet 2 inches. The largest of the new transatlantic ocean steamers, such as the City of Rome, and the Servia, are from 7,500 to 8,500 tons, or not half the size of the Great Eastern. The big ship has done the world good service in laying ocean cables, and if she can now be utilized in safely transporting across the Atlantic, during the finer months of the year, herds of cattle and flocks of sheep, she will in that event have yet a useful career before her.

Power of the Sun's Heat.

According to a recent estimate of Sir W. Armstrong, the heat of the sun falling upon one acre of the earth's surface in the tropics would be capable, if fully utilized, of developing a power of 4000 horses for nearly nine hours every day. The most promising means of adapting this vast energy to man's purpose seems to be the conversion of the heat into electricity, and a machine to test the matter on a small scale is now in course of construction.

Ex-Congressman Rainey, a colored Republican of South Carolina, received the unanimous vote of the Republican caucus for clerk of the House when there was no chance to elect him. Now that they have it in their power to elect him, Mr. Rainey is again a candidate, but it will be many a "Rainey" day before they elect him.

The colored cadet Whittaker has turned manager of a colored concert troupe that is said to sing gloriously. After all the discord of which he has been the cause, it seems no more than a proper atonement that he should now dispense a little harmony through the country.

The Boston Post says that the man who has been speculating in Confederate bonds explains that he did so because he wanted to tackle something that was a little safer than the average mining stock.

The Courier Journal puts this into the mouth of the Republican party: "When we want a Senator or a Judge, we buy him. That's how we keep ahead of the Democrats."

A NEWARK, N. J., bank cashier robbed the bank of over \$2,000,000. He stole everything except the bank building, and the safe which was a heavy one.

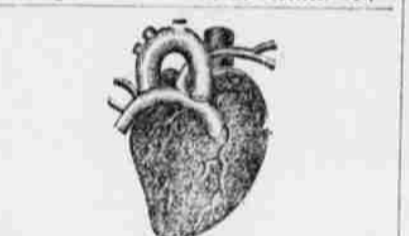
