mills; for the year 1878 93 mills for the year 1879 8 mills; for the year 1880, 83 mills. It will be seen by the above that the highest rate charged was less than one per cent per ton per mile. The rate for the year 1880, applied to the O. & C. R. R., being 84 mills per mile, for the distance of 200 miles, from Roseburg to Portland, would amount \$1 73 per ton, and from Salem to Portland to 45 cents per ton, for the entire distance. The existing rates on the O. & C. R. R. are from 45 mills for the lowest, to 113 1/2 mills per ton per mile for the highest.

We do not oppose railroads; our aim is simply to protect the people by JUST AND WHOLESOME REGULATIONS.

Whenever railroads in Oregon are constructed and operated on correct and just principles, rates will be satisfactorily low.

In view of the foregoing ominous facts, we say to the toiling many of our State, whose labor is daily enriching encroachers upon their dearest rights. It is you who furnish money to build the railroads, either by subsidies or by assessments levied on you in the shape of exorbitant rates of transportation, to meet the interest and principal of the bonded debt. The stock does not contribute one dollar towards the cost of the roads, but controls the roads and exacts high dividends to enrich its holders. The responsibility is with you to see that laws are enacted which, while inviting capital to seek employment among you at fair rates of remuneration in all legitimate enterprises, will enable you to control the power which always attends its vast accumulations—with you to see that no man is elevated to office who is not above bribery of railroad passes and personal favors—who is not worthy and true to your interests.
