More Pensions.

Every sort of device and contrivance for squandering the surplus in the Treasury, says the New York Sun, seems to be in vogue at Washington. The schemes already proposed for pensions in addition to those regularly paid and the swindling Arrearage act, passed for the benefit of claim agents and jobbers, would amount to more than one-third of the whole interest-paying part of the national debt. In round numbers, these schemes would cost six or seven hundred millions of dollars.

Now Mr. Harmer of Pennsylvania, whose name has frequently been associated with unsavory jobs, proposes a bill "granting annuity to persons having served faithfully twenty-five continuous years in the postal service of the United States, or who, after ten years of faithful service, shall become physically or mentally disabled." He would give these officeholders "two-thirds of the annual compensation" received by them "at the time of their resignation or inability." Mr. Harmer is very generous with the public money. If his proposition be good for Post Office servant, why not for the customs, the internal revenue, the land office, and all other branches of the civil service?

Therefore this bill, like some others more covert in their design, is nothing but an entering wedge for a civil pension list upon the British model, which is the favorite one with our professional reformers. The fundamental idea is to create a preferred class, to give them life estates in office, and when they get weary of little work or are sick, then to pension them on two-thirds pay for their remaining years.

This, then, is one of the "great measures" promised by the Republican leaders, to illustrate their return to power in the House of Representatives. In both branches of Congress they have brought forward bills to pension civil officers, and to depart from the wise practice which, with the exception of the Judges of the United States Courts, pensioned by a Republican Congress in 1869, has prevailed since the foundation of the Government, and has been regarded as one of its peculiar characteristics. We hope to see these projects brought distinctly to a clear vote, so that the name of every Representative may appear before his constituents along with all of these of the side he favors.

Newspaper Change.

The Daily Standard has passed from the control of Sutherland & Christie into the hands of A. Noltner and E. L. Bristow. The management from present appearances, will be under control of railroad influence. It must be said to the credit of the retiring firm that they conducted the only really alive daily of the Democratic persuasion ever published in Oregon. We hope the Standard will maintain its present standing in public estimation.

Suppose, now, suggests the Providence Star (Rep.), President and Cabinet and Congressmen cease talking about crushing out polygamy in Utah and begin to crush it out. The "determination" at Washington has been just as fixed as it is now for the last quarter of a century, but the Mormons have waxed strong, all the same, and are rapidly gaining control of other Territories besides Utah.

It cannot be denied but that the demand for Samuel J. Tilden as the leader of the Democracy in 1884 will be the boom of booms of the present century.

GUIREAU will at last have his wish for a foreign mission gratified. He will be sent on June 30th on an important errand to his Satanic Majesty's realm.

Ensilage.

The Ensilage Congress which was in session in New York for two days was not an assemblage of mere theorists or book farmers. Many of the members had spent time and money in building silos or pits for the preservation of green crops by the system known as ensilage. The principle of the system is simply to store green crops where they are excluded from the air. Much ingenuity was shown in the various methods chosen. Some had built costly pits with massive stone walls, tightened with cement; some had built wooden-lined cellars; some had dug holes in the ground; one man had tried storing his green crops in a wooden box above ground, and relied upon heavy weights to compact the mass and exclude the air. Many valuable practical hints as to the best methods were dropped during the two days' discussion. Many specimens of crops preserved by the ensilage process, and of milk and butter produced from animals fed on such crops, were exhibited. One man hit a great point of the ensilage when he said that the way to make the process prevalent was to show the farmer that there was money in it.

An Oregon Bill Reported Favorably.

The Senate committee on military affairs have agreed to recommend passage of Senator Grover's bill to reimburse the State of Oregon, for its expenditures in suppressing the Modoc Indian hostilities in 1872 and 1873, with an amendment reducing the total amount to be appropriated from \$131,000 to \$70,268.

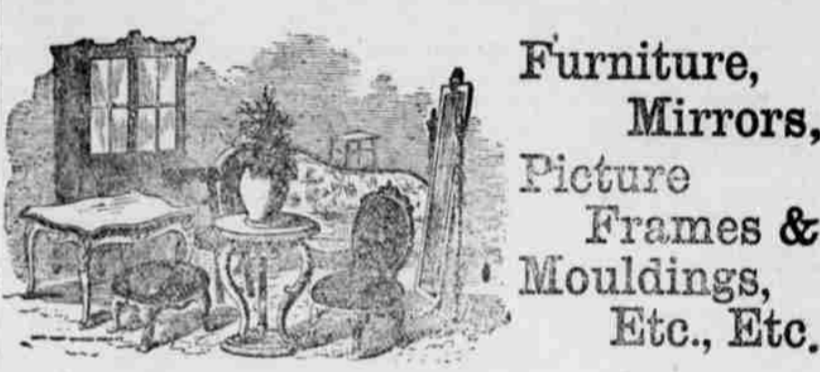
