

A Little Too Much.

There is rather more than enough of the Garfield begging business going on. An exchange says: First it was for the Mrs. Garfield fund. Then it was for a mother Garfield fund. Then it was for a Garfield hospital at Washington. This was followed by a Garfield professorship at Williams college. The Garfield church in Washington passed round its hat to catch a few golden drops from the rain of public generosity. And now the authorities of Cleveland want the people of the United States to raise \$150,000 toward a \$200,000 monument to Garfield in that city. Now the plain facts of the case are (1) that the people have already shown more sympathy for Garfield and done more for his family and memory than was ever done in the case of any former President; (2) there are other objects far worthier and more urgent than the building of a \$200,000 monument to Garfield in a city where he did not live; and (3) if the people of Cleveland want a Garfield monument costing \$200,000, they are abundantly able to build it.

From twenty to thirty miles from Denver, between Cherry creek and Running creek, the Denver and New Orleans railroad forces struck an unusual obstruction, it being nothing less than a buried forest. The trees are all petrified and agatized, are of all sizes, and lie buried at various depths, from ten to twenty feet deep, and as far as any excavation had been made by the workmen. They came upon these relics of a bygone age in at least half a dozen localities, and have met with not a little difficulty in their account. The trees are very perfect and could be taken out nearly whole if suitable machinery was employed.

Mormon missionaries, or, in other words, the pimps and procurers of the so-called Mormon Church, are industriously proselyting in various parts of the country. In some of the Pennsylvania towns it has been found necessary to pass special ordinances to put a stop to their operations in enticing away young women. They are also operating in Tennessee, particularly among the colored people, and in Georgia and North Carolina the missionaries are prosecuting a vigorous campaign. All of which shows that the prevailing awakening of public opinion against the Mormon abomination comes none too soon.
