

**Democratic State Convention.**

M., for the purpose of nominating a candidate for Congress, a candidate for Governor, a candidate for Chief Justice, a candidate for Secretary of State, a candidate for State Treasurer, a candidate for Superintendent Public Instruction, a candidate for Prosecuting Attorney in each of the Judicial Districts, and to transact such other business as may come before the convention. The convention will consist of 202 delegates, apportioned among the various counties as follows:
