

Recent Election Returns.

Philadelphia ever since the war of the rebellion has been the favorite abiding place of the "repeater." It held a city election the other day and bids fair to be redeemed permanently. Last year the election of a Democratic mayor broke the spell. Since then he has made such an exceptionally good record as to greatly strengthen his party, and as a consequence the Democrats have made a clean sweep of the city government, electing two-thirds of the city council. The mayor made most excellent arrangements to prevent repeating, and his success was evidenced by the fact that the vote fell off 45,000, although the contest was a most exciting one. The total vote of Philadelphia has for years been out of all proportion to the number of its population. Syracuse and other strong Republican cities of New York have elected Democratic mayors. The tendency of recent elections has been strongly in favor of the Democracy.

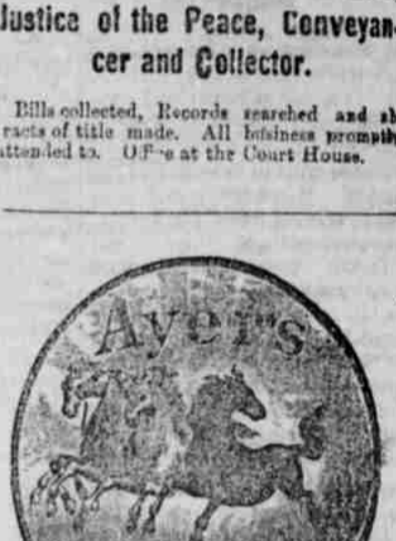
