THE PLATFORM.

The Democratic party of the State of Oregon in convention assembled, cognizant of the important consequences depending upon its deliberations, and affirming the principles of popular liberty and rights laid down by the founders of this government, do declare as follows:

1. That we favor houesty, efficiency and economy in every department of the government, both state and federal.

2. That we favor the equal protection of the rights of labor and capital under just laws.

3. That while we recognize and respect the legal rights of railroad enterprises, we demand that our legislatures, state and federal, enact such laws regulating the same, as may be necessary to prevent any unjust discrimination and oppression of the people.

4. That we demounce the present tariff system as class legislation havorable to the few and oppressive to the many; and therefore demand an immediate revision thereof, a reduction of all important duties to a strict revenue standard; and that the free list be so enlarged as to include all articles of mechanical, agricultural and domestic use among the people, as far as the needed revenue of the government will permit.

5. That the president's veto of the Chinese

will permit.

5. That the president's veto of the Chinese Immigration bill is a public misfortune. It sets the degrading mark of competition with coolies of China upon the labor of the workingmen of America, and it treats with contemptation of the contemptation uous disregard the unanimous protests and ap-peals of the entire Pacific coast. In behalf of the people of Oregon we disapprove and con-demn it, and declare it to be the duty of every citizen, regardless of party, to express his dis-approval with his vote as well as with his voice.

6. That the assassination of President Garfield was a national calamity to be regretted by
every law abiding citizen, and that said assassination was the result of the pernicious practice of the republican party in applying the
epoils system to every branch of the civil service of of our government.

7. We believe that polygamy is a crime
punishable by law and that its existence should
be made edious and impossible.

8. That we are in favor of a repeal of the
mavigation laws, and the removal of the duties on all materials that enter into the construction of vessels, so that produce can be cartried in American bottoms, and the American
ppeople be able to enter into competition for the
carrying trade of the world.

9. That we regard the improvement of the
Columbia river and its tributaries, the Yaquim and Coos bays,, the harbor of refuge at
Pert Orford, the Coquille river, the construction of the locks at the Cascades and Dalles of
the Columbia river, and the improvement of
other harbors and rivers of our state as essential to the prosperity of its people, and we demand of our senators and representative in
congress their best endeavors to secure fiberal
eppropriations and favorable legislation therefor by the general government, to the end that
the whole of Oregon may share in the certain
benefits ensuing from competition in transportation.

10. That we favor the maintenance of public

10. That we favor the maintenance of public schools, the hope and pride of a free state, and we demand such ways and means as will contribute to the increase of funds for that pur-

11. That we favor the taxation of all mort gages in the county where the same are re-

12. We assert that it is the duty of the leg islature to enact such laws as will make the compensation of clerk and sheriff of every county in this state commensurate with the

services performed.

13. We denounce any organization or legislation that would proscribe any citizen on account of religion or nationality:
