

THE PLATFORM.

The Democratic party of the State of Oregon in convention assembled, cognizant of the important consequences depending upon its deliberations and affirming the principles of popular liberty and rights laid down by the founders of this government, do declare as follows:

1. That we favor honest, efficiency and economy in every department of the government, both state and federal.

2. That we favor the equal protection of the rights of labor and capital under just laws.

3. That while we recognize and respect the legal rights of railroad enterprises, we demand that our legislatures, state and federal, enact such laws regulating the same, as may be necessary to prevent any unjust discrimination and oppression of the people.

4. That we denounce the present tariff system as class legislation favorable to the few and oppressive to the many; and therefore demand an immediate reduction thereof, a reduction of all import duties to a strict revenue standard; and that the free list be so enlarged as to include all articles of mechanical, agricultural and domestic use among the people, as far as the needed revenue of the government will permit.

5. That the president's veto of the Chinese immigration bill is a palpable infidelity to the spreading mass of competition with the peoples of China upon the labor of the working men of America, and it treats with contemptions disregard the unanimous protest and appeals of the entire Pacific coast. We hold it of the people of Oregon we disapprove and condemn it, and declare it to be the duty of every citizen, regardless of party, to express his disapproval with his vote as well as with his voice.

6. That the assassination of President Garfield was a national calamity to be regretted by every law abiding citizen, and that said assassination was the result of the perfidious practice of the republican party in applying the spoils system to every branch of the civil service of our government.

7. We believe that polygamy is a crime punishable by law and that its existence should be made odious and impossible.

8. That we are in favor of a repeal of the navigation laws, and the removal of the restrictions on all materials that enter into the construction of vessels, so that produce can be carried in American bottoms, and the American people be able to enter into competition for the carrying trade of the world.

9. That we regard the improvement of the Columbia river and its tributaries, the Yaquina and Coos bays, the harbor of refuge at Fort Stevens, the Cascadia river, the construction of locks at the Cascades and Dalles of the Columbia river, and the improvement of other harbors and rivers of our state as essential to the prosperity of its people, and we demand of our senators and representatives in Congress their unceasing efforts to secure fiscal appropriations and favorable legislation therefor by the general government, to the end that the whole of Oregon may share in the certain benefits ensuing from competition in transportation.

10. That we favor the maintenance of public schools, the hope and pride of a free state, and we demand such ways and means as will contribute to the increase of funds for that purpose.

11. That we have the taxation of all property in the county where the same are recorded.

12. We assert that it is the duty of the legislature to enact such laws as will make the compensation of clerk and sheriff of every county in this state commensurate with the services performed.

13. We denounce any organization or legislation that would proscribe any citizen on account of religion or nationality.
