STATE NEWS. Wood is selling at \$8 per cord in Pendleton. The tax levy of Curry county is 25 mills on the dollar.

There are more young women among the students of Pacific University than at any previous year in its history. George Hulery of McMinnville is under bonds of \$100 to answer before the grand jury to the charge of keeping a gambling house.

The Oregon presbytery of the Cumberland Presbyterian Church will hold its regular session at Woodburn, Marion county, commencing Thursday Oct. 28. About 50,000 cans of salmon have been put up this season at the cannery of Reed & Co., below Gardiner.

The total value of taxable property of Curry county, as returned by the assessor is \$312,764; number of polls in the county, 174; indebtedness of the county, \$97,328.

The amount of grain stored in the several warehouses of Corvallis is about 215,000, of which J. A. Cauthorn received 125,000, T. J. Blair 60,000, and De Clark & Samuels 30,000. Assessor Crandall, of Washington county furnishes the following report of that county's wealth: Gross valuation, \$3,528,165; indebtedness, \$387,705; exemption, \$284,710; total taxable property, \$2,355,750.

The barn on Joe Brown's farm, about half way between Sheridan and Willamina, was burned last Wednesday. Perry Morgan had the place rented and lost his hay, wheat, oats, hock, harness and many of his farming utensils; loss all told about \$1500.

East Oregonian: At the last session of the Circuit Court for Union county, judgment was rendered against the Blue Mountain Consolidated Road Co., and in favor of E. A. Foster, for the sum of \$39,330, upon which execution has been issued to the sheriff Martin of Umatilla county.

Mr. Scott, who lives on the old Burden farm, near Grande Ronde, Yamhill county, thought that last Friday, while it was dry, hot and breezy, he would burn his straw and stubble. Well, he succeeded, and burned also a mile of fence, a good orchard and a part of Frank Hussey's fence.
