Effects of Odors on Milk.

Upon this question Professor Arnold, in the work "American Dairy. ing," says: "The London Milk Journal cites instances where milk that he stood a short time in the presence of persons sick with typhoid fever, or laing handled by parties before fully recovered from smallpox, has sprea these diseases as effectually as if the persons themselves had been present Scarlatina, measles and other contagious diseases have been spread in the same way. The peculiar smell of a cellar is indelibly impressed upon all the butter made from milk standing in it. A few puffs from a pipe or a cigar will scent all the milk in a room, and a smoking lamp will do the same. A pail of n ilk standing ten minutes where it will take the scent of a strong smelling stable, or any other offensive odor, will imbibe a taint that will never

leave it. "A maker of gilt-edged butter objects to cooling warm milk in the room, where his milk stands for the cream to. rise, because he says the odor escaping from the new milk while cooling is taken in by the other milk and retained. to the injury of his butter. This may seem like descending to little things, but it must be remembered that it is the sum of such little things that determines whether the products of the dairy are to be sold at cost or below; or as a high-priced luxury. If milk is to be converted into an article of the last class, it must be handled and kept in clean and sweet vessels, and must stand in pure fresh air, such as would be desirable and healthy for people to
