The "Chinook" Defined.

The thermal current, known as the Japan current, having its origin at the Equator near the 130th degree of east longitude, Greenwich, flowing northwardly to the Aleutian Islands, where it separates, one branch flowing eastwardly along the peninsula of Alaska, and then southwardly along the coast of British Columbia, Washington Territory and Oregon. This thermal stream with its concomitant heated atmospheric current, striking the northwest coast of America, operates powerfully in mitigating a climate which otherwise would be cold and rigorous in the extreme. The effect of these currents upon the western portion of this territory is the same as the effect of the Gulf Stream upon the northwest coast of Europe. In fact the climate and natural productions of England are essentially the same as those of Western Washington. In addition to this, the prevailing winds in the winter are from the southwest. Those warm atmospheric currents, coming from the tropical regions of the Pacific, laden with moisture, meeting the cooler currents from the coast range and Cascade mountains, produce the winter rainfall. Those southwest winds also moderate the temperature during winter.—Governor Newell.

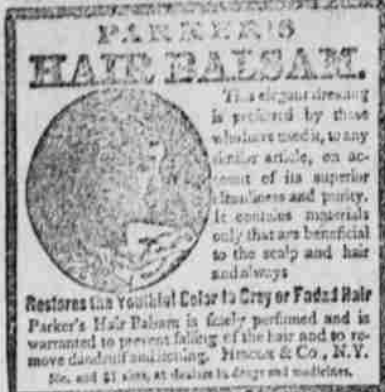

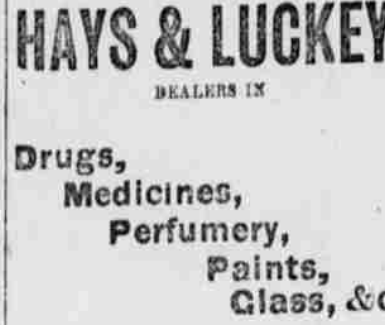
