Senator Slater has proposed several amendments to the tariff bill during its discussion in the Senate, among them to put jute on the free list, which was carried by a vote of 23 to 22; also jute butts, on which the hill proposed a duty of \$6 per ton, which was also agreed to-35 to 11. On motion of Slater the duty on jute yarns and burlaps of jute was made 20 per cent. ad valorem, and the duty on gunny cloth, valued at less than 10 cents a aquare 'yard, reduced from 3 to 21 cents per pound; also the rate on manufactures of jute not otherwise provided for was made 25 per cent. ad valorem.

Speaking of the appointment of the Superintendent of the Insane Asylum, the Weston Leader says: Dr. Carpenter, of Portland, has been appointed Superintendent of the State Insane Asylum. He is one of those who took an active part in pushing the Asylum Bill and in opposing the present system of keeping the insane. The appointment looks too much like a reward for services rendered, and we presume is but a beginning of that pernicious plan of prostituting to political purposes, as has been done with all the other public institutions of the State. The present incumbent, Dr. S. E. Josephi, has filled the position ably and well, and ought to be retained. But he studiously attends to his business and never figures in politics or hobbies, consequently there would have been no political capital made by his appointment.

D. M. Sabin, the newly-elected Senator from Minnesota, owes his election to Democratic votes. He is a large manufacturer and State prison contractor at Stillwater. He has never held office, except in the Legislature, and is only 39 years of age. She still remains in jail with other witnesses in the case not out on bonds, and will not be permitted to go until after the prisoner has been sentenced.
