Guilty.

Alfred Andersen, charged with killing his brother, has been found guilty of murder in the first degree.

His attorneys, Chapman & Gregory, "fought a good fight," but the evidence against the defendant was too direct.

Three gentlemen, however, claim that there was not sufficient legal evidence to convict their client, and that they will appeal their case to the Supreme Court.

On Thursday, the day set for Andersen's sentence, a Welcome reporter visited Andersen in his cell last night, and found him lying flat on his back with his hands across his breast, and in a very uncommunicative mood.

He assumed to be indifferent regarding the verdict and his death, saying: "I hope my enemies are satisfied now." He is very bitter against those who testified against him, avowing in very strong language, that he was convicted by false swearing.

After he was brought back to his cell yesterday, Jailor Dougherty searched him from head to foot, and closely examined the doomed man's cage, to see that nothing had been secreted that might aid his escape or any suicidal intent he may have.

Bertha Nelson was found to have been crying as if her heart would break, feeling, no doubt, that she had been the cause of two brothers' deaths.

She still remains in jail with other witnesses in the case not out on bonds, and will not be permitted to go until after the prisoner has been sentenced.

The general feeling is that Alfred Andersen murdered his brother, and that he should be hanged for it, and the outlook for a new trial appears to our non-judicial eyes as very gloomy.—Portland Welcomer.
