Texas, the banner Democratic State, is a fearful example Republican newspapers do not refer to. In Texas there are 6,200 miles of railway lines, growing two miles daily. Tax is 30 cents on each \$1,000. There are \$4,250,000 in the State Treasury. State bonds are worth 40 per cent premium, and the debt of the State was reduced by that rare old genius, Governor Roberts, who doesn't believe in political thanksgiving days, \$1,400,000 last year, leaving of balance of Texas bonds outstanding, and held mainly by Texas schools and institutions of learning, of \$1,000,000 five per cent. The State's taxable wealth has grown from \$280,000,000, in 1877, to \$410,000,000, in 1882. The free school fund will soon be \$6,361,000. More than a million dollars were dispensed last year among free schools, attended by 295,000 pupils. A white and colored normal school provide home teachers. The University of Texas has 1,000,000 acres of choice land, and there is engrafted in the constitution of Texas a provision enabling a poor man to invest \$5,000 in real estate and making it his homestead. It cannot be mortgaged or sold for debt, and only conveyed absolutely by the joint deed of man and wife.
