Seattle has 925 voters and 87 saloons, which is one saloon to every twelve men and a small boy.

The head sawyer, Thornton, at Skiel's sawmill at Potlatch, I. T., got his hand caught by the saw while in motion, and nearly severed from his arm.

It is estimated that 14,000 logs will be taken out of the east fork of the north fork of Coos river this winter. There are 12,000 logs already cut, all of which are over two miles from tide water.

The Columbia Chronicle says: A little son of A. Ragan, aged about 9 years, living in the country, while riding a fractious horse recently, was thrown to the ground and his lower jaw broken in two places.

M. R. R. Daniels, of the Lafayette mills, had his hand so badly crushed in the mill gearing recently, that his thumb and three fingers on his right hand had to be amputated close to his hand. He had been rubbing a cog-wheel which had begun to cut, with a bar of soap, when his hand caught between the cogs with the result above stated.

F. Turnahan, of Bradbury, has been in town for several days. He brought up a raft of some 500,000 feet of logs, and disposed of the same to Messrs Huckle Bros. Mr. Turnahan is one of the largest loggers of Columbia county. He has already got out some 2,500,000 feet of logs since last March.—Misc.

On Wednesday last Mr. Wm. Hardin, fell from his granary to the floor, a distance of twelve feet striking on a scantling in his descent. He received fatal internal injuries and expired Thursday afternoon. He was a partner of Henry Workins and a member of the United Workingmen. He leaves a wife and four children.—Grant County News.

To make a good, serviceable telephone, good from one farm-house to another, only requires enough wire and two cigar boxes.
