The Cour d'Alens Mines.

Mr A F Parker of the Nez Perce News, has the following to say about the new diggings: So far as at present prospect the gold belt reaches from the head of the San Jose river to the North Fork of Coeur d'Alens river.

Eagle City is the only camp so far of any importance. It is at the junction of Eagle and Pritchard creeks, and at present consists of 25 or 30 log huts and shanties. There will no doubt be other camps spring up, as one point could not possibly supply such an extensive and wealthy scope of country.

The whole country is thickly wooded, indeed so much so as to be a source of great expense in operating the mines. Lumber is very scarce, notwithstanding the abundance of timber.

Elected Speaker.

John G Carlisle, of Kentucky, was elected Speaker of the House of Representatives, upon the assembling of Congress, Monday, December 3d, Mr Carlisle is one of the ablest men in that body, and is heartily in sympathy with the producers of the country being opposed to the pernicious doctrine of the present prohibitory tariff.
