DESERT WONDERS .-- Conductor Jerry Long of the Southern Pacific Rai'road, yesterday brought in a sample of crystals of Rock salt from the Colorado Desert, near India, 200 feet below sea level. There is a vast led of this salt there, and the Southern Pacific Railroad in laying the track to the salt mine have been obliged to grade the road for 1,200 feet with blocks of these beautiful lumps of salt crystals. This is the first instance of a railroad roadbed being laid and ballasted in salt, of which we have any knowledge. The sea which once rolled over this place dried up and left a vast bed of salt about fifty miles in length. The quality is superb, and the supply inexhaustible. Grasshoppers of enormous size and giant centipedes, have been here pickted in this chloride of sodium and are to day, after an elapse of centuries in full size and perfection of shape, as effectually settled in substance as Lot's wife. This vast salt bed will be very valuable to the reducers of ores in Cali fornia, Arizonia and New Mexico, and can be supplied in boundless quantities. -Los Angeles Herald.

THE REPUBLICAN CONVENTION. - The next National Republican Convention will comprise 802 d.-legates, instead of 738 as heretofore. The increase results from the enlargement of the House of Representatives. Two delegates are allowed from each Congressional District, and four at large from ca h State to represent the Senatorial votes. So it will require 402 to nominate, instead of 370 as heretofore.
