Republican State Ticket.

The Republican Convention which met at Portland last Wednesday, nominated Binger Herman, of Roseburg, for Congress. Mr. Herman is a lawyer of fair ability, and has the reputation of belonging to the "half breed" faction of the Republican party, having done much kicking against that party since his removal from the Roseburg land office. He is a professional office-seeker, having been beaten two years ago by Mr. R. S. Bean for the nomination of Judge of this district.

L. Flynn, of Albany, received the nomination for Supreme Judge. It is said that he is incompetent to fill the position. This selection speaks badly for the judgment of the convention, when such able lawyers as W. Lair Hill, Judge Kelsay, J. W. Whalley and others were seeking the office. We believe the people of Oregon next June will say, we want an able jurist to fill the position of Supreme Judge and not a third-rate lawyer, and therefore will elect Gov. W. W. Thayer to that important position.

Messrs. D. P. Thompson of Multnomah, Warren Truitt of Polk, and J. C. Leasure of Umatilla were nominated for Presidential Electors. All are good men.

The following delegates were elected to the National Convention, which meets at Chicago June 3d. A. G. Hovey of Lane, Deany of Linn, Dolph of Multnomah, Apperson of Clackamas, Swift of Union, and McConnell of Yamhill.

James W. Hamilton, the Democratic nominee for prosecuting attorney of this district, is too well known to most of our readers to need any recommendation from us. He served the people of this district in the attorney's office during the years 1880 and 1881 to their satisfaction. He will certainly run ahead in Lane county. The people are becoming tired of electing pettifoggers to that important office and therefore will give Hamilton a rousing majority.

The Journal in its notice of the Republican county ticket says that most of them are anti-monopolists. If they are consistent in their principles, they will certainly withdraw from that party, as the "good" of the party, requires isolated Republicans attentions to sacrifice their principles.

Popular Sentiment.

The Portland Standard becomes daily more and more joyful over our ticket, platform and prospects.

The Oregonian speaks in the very highest terms of John Myers and Gov. Thayer, and thus refers to our tariff plank:

"The tariff resolution adopted by the Democratic convention is a good one—for Oregon. But it will not be accepted, even by the Democratic party, in the manufacturing States. And though Oregon and other non-manufacturing States were plundered by the protection which the east exacts, remonstrance on our part is almost useless against the overwhelming political weight of those States which insist on a policy that keeps out foreign goods in order that their own profits may be enhanced at our expense.

The Sunday Welcome truthfully says: "The man who would refuse to support the platform adopted by the Democratic State convention at The Dalles would refuse to support his own family. The planks referring to the forfeiture of unearned railroad lands; a more effective mechanics' lien law; the abolition of the prison contract system and a law to bring about uniform assessment and taxation are especially strong and timely, and will meet much favor among the people throughout the State."

The nomination of Hon. J. W. Hamilton for Prosecuting Attorney of this district, meets with the utmost satisfaction. It is in every respect a popular and wise selection. Mr. Hamilton was once our Prosecuting Attorney and proved himself an honorable and efficient officer. Although a dashing young gentleman, Mr. Hamilton as a lawyer takes high rank among the oldest. This office is non-political and we can safely count upon hundreds of Republican votes for our candidate and nobody will regret his election.—Roseburg Independent.

We already hear rumors of Republicans trying to trade on candidates. Democrats, remember that all our candidates were nominated fairly, and deserve your unqualified support.
