Statements of the upper House are now trying to change the Naval appropriation bill to the shape favored by the Senate committee, which means \$5,500,000 in excess of the amount voted by the House. In the course of some remarks Senator McPherson said that while the Government persisted in keeping the present Secretary of the Navy, it could not wonder at a lack of confidence in the Navy Department. Senator Hale retorted that it would be impossible for the New Jersey Senator to take his seat without getting off some bile against Secretary Chandler; whereupon Senator McPherson referred the gentleman from Maine to the newspapers of the country for opposition bile. Senator Vest explained the decline of the American Merchant Marine in a long speech and arraigned the Republican party because, having had charge of the Government since 1861, the country was without a navy. Senator Hale replied that in the last twelve years the Democrats had been in power both in the Senate and House. Mr. Vest said they had a little sporadic control of the Senate and House for about three months, but he wanted to know what they could have done with a Republican President. Senator Beck told the Maine Senator that if he would go into the detail of the naval expenditures of the last twenty years, the official records would prove rottenness and corruption in the administration of the funds.

The Sharon vs Sharon drama is still being enacted at San Francisco, although it is said that there will be a vacation during the month of June and until the 10th of July. The San Francisco papers begin to wonder where all the money comes from to pay plaintiff's costs and expenses is somewhat of a mystery. Some say that a stock company was formed before the suit was commenced whose members are assessed for the costs, and that one of the chief assessment payers is a wealthy lady. But this is all conjecture it is presumed, as it is hardly probable that any one going into such a speculation would let it be known. Be this as it may, there is being and will be a good many fortunes spent in the case before it is ended.
