NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT by virtue of an execution duly issued out of the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon, for the County of Lane, by the Clerk thereof, on to-wit, the 21st day of July, 1884, and to me directed upon a judgment rendered in said Court December 9, 1878, in a suit then and there pending wherein A. H. Spire was plaintiff, and A. Lorch and H. Lorch partners, doing business under the firm name of Lorch Bros., defendants, in favor of said plaintiff for the sum of \$4,703.55, which judgment was docketed in said Court December 9, 1878, by which writ of execution I was directed to make the sum of \$3,314.23 and costs of said writ, I did on to-wit July 21, 1884, levy upon all the right title and interest of the said defendants above named, and to the following described real property to-wit:
