The present session of the Legislature will come to an end at midnight to-morrow. A vast amount of important work has been done by the Legislature but it has also passed some measures that will be condemned by the people.

The Legislature has appropriated about \$125,000 for a new penitentiary building and for the completion of the capital. Two new counties have been created by the Legislature those of Monow and Gillam in Eastern Oregon.

Political economists, politicians and writers in general have been puzzled to assign adequate causes for the present hard times when money is plenty and good as gold and crops are abundant.

New York Special: The most brilliant surgical case yet recorded is an operation recently performed at the Chambers Street hospital. In this case precedent was openly defied and the attending surgeons saved a human life and performed an operation of a kind that has never been performed with success.
