

Freezing out a moonshiner.

The revenue raiders have no very thrilling experiences sometimes. A few nights ago a party of raiders were up the Marietta and North Georgia Railroad. Col. Charles Marshall, of Baltimore, chief of Gen. Lee's staff, speaking of the general's surrender at Appomattox, and of the meeting of Gen. Grant and Lee, says: "When shown into the room Gen. Grant advanced and shook hands with Gen. Lee. The federal commander was in dress uniform. Gen. Grant by way of apology to Gen. Lee (for coming without baggage and because of his desire to reach the place for the ceremony he had hastened to) was the only allusion to a sword that was made at the interview. After the terms of surrender were settled, Gen. Grant explained that he was advised that Lee's forces had a number of federal prisoners who, like their captors, were out of rations. Gen. Sheridan replied he would supply 25,000 rations. Gen. Grant then instructed him to send 25,000 rations to Gen. Lee's commissary. After the interview Gen. Lee asked for Gen. Williams and thanked that officer for his kindness to his son, Gen. Curtis Lee, who had been captured several days before. When Gen. Lee and Col. Marshall rode away, the federal officers filled the front porch. Col. Marshall is not sure Gen. Grant was among them, for his thoughts were busy with other matters at the time.

The water supply of St. Petersburg is found to contain only 300 germs to the cubic centimeter, although the source from which the supply is obtained contains bacteria to the number of 10,000 per cubic centimeter. Investigation shows that the destruction of the germ is due to the rapid motion of the water where it leaves the main source of supply. Acting upon this discovery, a noted engineer recently employed a centrifugal machine which he constructed hastily, and found that after subjecting the impure water to action for one hour, the number of germs was reduced 90 per cent. Upon the basis of this experiment, it would seem possible to clear a city's water supply by subjecting it to a centrifugal motion.
