### The Boutt Bill Sustnined.

The opinion of Judge Deady on the recent petition of the receiver of the Oregon & California Railroad, asking for instructions as to the management of the road in the particulars in which it is effected by the Hoult law, was given ex-parte on Monday sustaining the main features of the bill. The particulars in which the receiver is instructed are:

1. To carry passengers at a rate not exceeding four cents a mile on any portion of the road, and for as much less on the whole or any part thereof as he may think advisable;

2. To charge no more for the carriage of goods than the maximum allowed by the act, nor more for a short haul than a long one in the same direction except to and from points where the rate obtainable is affected by water transportation, in which case he may carry at as low a rate as the water craft do, without reference to the length of the haul;

3. To continue the interchange of freight with the Oregon Railway on the footing of the present arrangements as long as they may think advisable;

In the discharge of his duties, to otherwise obey and conform to the provisions of the act.

An examination of local prison sta tiaties reveals some startling facts. There are 75,000 criminals in the State of New York, one-lifth of that number on an average being in the custody of the various institutions. The increase in the State's criminal population since 1870 has been thirty three per cent., while the whole population has increased but 20 per cent That our system of prison discipline does not act as a deterrent is inf-rred from the fact that an increasing number of the prison inmates are found to be old offenders. In English prisons, on the other hand, where the work is harder, the fare slimmer and silence between the inmates is rigorously enforced, according to the testimony of Sir Edward de Cane the criminal statistics have lately decreased. So it will be seen while there is on the one side here a class of sentimentalists who are demanding further relaxation of discipline in the name of prison reform, there is on the other side a class of sociologists who point to the new Eng-Bish system of enforced silence as an apparently effective means of making orime odious in the eyes of the element of the population especially addicted no it .- N. Y. Herald.


