

The Roseburg Tragedy.

The latest and most reliable news from Roseburg in relation to the recent murder near that place is to this effect: The man who was brutally murdered commonly went by the name of Sullivan, but he doubtless possessed several aliases. Early Wednesday, Oct. 15th, it appears, eight tramps assembled in Roseburg. Apparently they came from different directions, and seemed strangers to each other before meeting in the place. After drinking and carousing until about dark, they all started off together, coming north on the railroad track. Sullivan, the victim, was the owner of an old watch, which he managed to sell for \$4. Other members of the gang of tramps wanted him to divide the money, which he refused to do. They then set upon and murdered him. After beating Sullivan nearly to death, they fired several shots into his body and left it.

The murder is supposed to have been perpetrated about 7 o'clock near the railway trestle, half a mile from town. One of the tramps went back and notified the city marshal that they had found a man apparently murdered. He afterwards half confessed his participation in the deed. Four of the tramps were arrested besides the informant. The other two escaped. A post mortem examination revealed the fact that Sullivan's neck was broken. It is likely that this was done with a club before the pistol shots were fired. The gun-shot wounds were sufficient to cause death. The five men are in custody charged with murder, but the other two tramps who escaped were at large at the latest accounts.
