Report on the Fish Ladder.

REPORT ON THE FISH LADDER.—Wallace Baldwin, the fish commissioner, has filed his report on the fish ladder with the Secretary of State. He gives the following inventory of damages that the structure sustained: Head drift breaker slightly damaged, from which three tons loose rock falling and five planks are gone; head gates and piers in which some worked all gone; upper ladder slightly damaged, mostly by filling with loose rock; water dam slightly damaged; slack water pool between sections of ladder somewhat filled up, but not to materially affect workings of same; lower section of ladder badly damaged; side walls and steps down to No 14 all gone, and the stone washed into the ladder, filling it up. He says that both salmon and trout ascended it in large numbers which is news to everyone in Oregon City.
