

Habitual Criminals.

The annual report of the Warden of the Joliet, Illinois, penitentiary shows, says the Chicago Herald, that of the convicts now confined there 204 are serving their second term, forty-eight their third, nineteen their fourth, nine their fifth, and four their sixth. Many of these, as well as of the others not mentioned herein, have served one or more terms in other prisons. This emphasizes the fact, already well known, that the majority of the men and women confined in prisons are habitual criminals who are not reformed by punishment, but on release immediately resume the habits of life which soon lead them again into crime and back to prison.

Confronted by the undoubted truth that reformation is about the last thing that our prisons accomplish, the question presents itself whether the fault lies with the system or with the criminals. If it is with the system, then some intelligent effort should be made to correct it. If the system is fair enough, and if it affords convicts the opportunity and the incentive to amend their ways, all of which advantages are lost upon them, then the habitual criminal act should be applied with greater vigor than ever. The incorrigible criminal is not worth temporizing with. Mercy shown him is wasted. Freedom granted him is but the opportunity to indulge his evil propensities. The short term cures him of nothing, and amounts practically to nothing more than a vacation from his regular business.

One term in the penitentiary ought to cure a man forever of the weakness which brought him there, unless his moral nature has become hopelessly blunted. In that case his enlargement only adds to the expense and the terror of society, and thus inflicts a double burden upon it. Knowledge that perseverance in crime will lead to life imprisonment would be likely to have a salutary effect upon men and women who emerge from the penitentiary after serving one term.—Telegram.
