

Another call for the redemption of \$10,000,000 3 per cent. bonds has just been made by Secretary Manning. This leaves only \$30,000,000 of the 3-per cents. to be redeemed. These will all be called in by July 1st, after which no more bonds become due until 1891. In the meantime the surplus money is accumulating in the treasury at the rate of \$100,000,000 per year, and congress has done nothing to reduce it. The Republicans in the House, aided by the Randall contingent, has been able to defeat all efforts for reduction of the revenue.

It is now about a quarter of a century since Prince Bismarck uttered the most famous of all his historic phrase. It was a budget debate in which he was beaten by an adverse vote. "It is not," he said "by speechifying and the votes of majorities that the great questions of the age are to be settled by blood and iron."
