New York Elections.

For the past twenty-one years, or since 1867, the Democratic victories in the State of New York have numbered sixteen and the Republican five, as the following table will show:

In 1863 the state went Republican, and in 1864 gave its electoral vote to Lincoln. In 1867 the state went Democratic, and in 1868 went for Seymour.

Congress.

Both Houses of Congress convened in regular session last Monday. In the Senate all Senators elected were sworn in except Faulkner of West Virginia...

The opposition of the New York Tribune to the confirmation of Mr. Lamar as Justice of the Supreme Court is ostensibly based on his political record. The real reason very probably is that such a judge as Lamar would be decidedly objectionable to certain monopolists.

There are only two excuses for holding a National Republican Convention next year. One of these is to designate the particular goat who shall be sacrificed, and the other is that this country will be flooded with persuasive arguments in the shape of boodie.

It only took the Republican party 24 years to wreck the finest merchant marine in the world, and they seem to be proud of their achievements. John Roach's old tubs, and the increase of the British merchant navy, is the sum of what was made and done in those years.

The U. S. was the first maritime power in the world in 1860, but a stupid Republican President, still on the statute books, which the President would sweep away in one minute, if he had his will, is making our shipping interest dwindle and fall away to almost nothing.

The Republican party started out with a "moral idea." The "moral idea" ashamed of the bad company it was keeping separated from the party after a few years, and now it is solely and singularly for the loaves and fishes the g. o. p. survives.

45,000,000 acres of land have reverted to the Government since March 4, 1885. This is genuine reform.

The Supreme Court of the United States rendered two very important decisions on the 5th inst. By one the prohibition law of the State of Kansas was sustained, and the judgment of the U. S. district court of Kansas rendering compensation for breweries and distilleries rendered worthless by the law was reversed...

The other decision is a tax case from Virginia wherein the state was sought to be enjoined from collection of taxes where tenders had been made of tax receivable coupons actually that a state cannot be used or coerced in federal courts either by action against her in name or against her officials.

The Atlanta, planned by Republicans, and built by John Roach, is dangerous, and may sink at any time, if not entirely reconstructed. The report of Captain Bunch, her commander, she has a speed of 14 knots per hour. The three new cruisers being built under this Democratic administration will have a minimum speed of 19 knots per hour.

There is no free-trade party in this country. There is a party, however, whose leader echoes its wishes when he recommends that taxes which bring into the U. S. Treasury \$100,000,000 annually more than the Government needs, should be reduced.

The President has sent the following nominations to the Senate: L. Q. C. Lamar, Associate Justice of the Supreme Court of the United States; William F. Vilas, Secretary of the Interior, and Don M. Dickinson, Postmaster General.

Most of the European States support protectionist principles. The states of Europe that are not protectionist, pay the highest wages and are wealthier than the adjoining countries.

J. Sharp, Rep., gets a new trial, and Belden, Rep., goes to Congress. Sharp will have another trial immediately, and if cleared, will run for Congress in New York as a Republican.
