A Terrible Cyclone.

A dispatch from Mt. Vernon, Ill., Feb. 20, gives the following particulars of a terrible storm that swept over that city: The cyclone that visited this city yesterday afternoon at 5 o'clock destroyed nearly three hundred residences and unhoused from 1200 to 1500 persons.
