

**Remarkable Catch of Halibut.**

Captain Calder, commanding the fishing schooner Mollie Adams, arrived in Seattle Wednesday evening from Flattery banks with 40,000 pounds of halibut. Some of these halibut weighed 150 pounds. The schooner left Port Townsend last Thursday, reached Cape Flattery Saturday, and the crew fished until Monday noon, a day and a half. In this short time they had made a catch of twenty tons. It was the intention of Capt. Jacobs, the owner of the schooner, to have her proceed to Alaska to capture seals, but this brilliant achievement has changed his mind, and the schooner will remain in the fishing business, with Seattle as her shipping center, as long as it is profitable.—Tacoma News 8th.

The supreme court of Minnesota has decided that the state railroad and warehouse commission has power to fix rates and fares. The railroads admitted that the legislature had this right. This was decided by the federal supreme court in the Granger cases. But they claimed that the legislature could not delegate the right to a commission. But the Minnesota court affirms this right in the most positive terms. The Pioneer Press says the decision carries with it such far reaching consequences, empowering as it does, the commission to dictate freight schedules of all kinds to the railroads in the state, that the case is sure to be taken to the supreme court of the United States for final adjudication.
