

## The Eugene City Guard.

### Council Proceedings.

COUNCIL CHAMBER, EUGENE CITY,  
Or., July 9, 1888.

Present Mayor Dunn, Councilmen McClung, Friendly, Bilyeu, and Matlock, Recorder and Marshal.

The minutes of the last regular meeting and adjourned meeting read and approved.

The Finance Committee reported favorably on the following bills, and on motion orders were drawn for the several amounts:

C M Collier, \$60.75; Mrs F H L Swinner, \$1; S Heller, \$2; H Wallace, \$3; U W L Mfg Co, \$62.88; L Davis, \$2; G F Croner, \$3; Midgley & Dyingler, \$4; Register, \$2; J T Witter, \$1; H J Day, \$3.40; C Sovern, \$3; B F Dorris, \$106.05.

Mr. Bilyeu, from the committee on judiciary, reported the purchase of that part of 13th situated between Willamette and Oak street, paying therefor to G. H. Parks and wife \$300, and P. E. and J. C. Snodgrass \$140. The action of the committee approved and deeds ordered on file.

Mr. Friendly, president of the board of directors of the Eugene fire department, presented the application of "Oregon Hose Team" for admission into the fire department with the recommendation that the company be admitted. On motion the recommendation was adopted and the team admitted.

Mr. Friendly, from the committee on fire and water, reported the rejection of the city's proposition authorized at the last meeting by the Eugene Water Co.

Mr. J. F. Robinson, Sec. of the Water Co, on behalf of the company, submitted several propositions to furnish the city with water, number two being as follows:

To the Honorable City Council of Eugene City: GENTLEMEN. The Eugene Water Co. believing that an unlimited fire protection would be more desirable than the service as used during the past year, we would respectfully submit for your consideration the following proposition:

The Eugene Water Co. will furnish the city of Eugene water for fire purposes (and service for City Hall and engine house) for a term of five or ten years on the following terms: The city to furnish any and all hydrants gates and necessary connections, and to have the privilege of locating as many hydrants as your honorable body may choose, at and on all street corners where the company's mains are located or may be located during the term of contract.

Said hydrants to be put in under the supervision of the superintendent of the Eugene water company. And for said service the Eugene water company shall receive the sum of \$1 000 per year, during the contract. Payment to be made monthly.

After due consideration, on motion of Mr. Matlock proposition No. 2 was accepted and the committee authorized to enter into contract with the Water Co, for a term of ten years, the present contract to remain in force until 20 hydrants are in place.

Mr. Friendly, from the committee on fire and water, recommended an additional street light to be located on the corner of Oak and Seventh streets. On motion the recommendation of the committee was adopted and the light ordered.

The monthly reports of the treasurer and recorder were read and ordered on file.

A proposition from S. A. Ogden to furnish gravel for all new street crossings and all repairs by the year was read and referred to the committee on streets.

Mr. Friendly, from the committee on finance, reported the estimated expenses of the city for the ensuing year to be \$8,816.

On motion it was ordered that a tax of five mills be levied upon all real and personal property for the current year.
