

Why Do Britons Come Hither.

Why do British subjects come to our country to live? Because we levy protective taxes on imports, or because we have a horrid surplus of 155 millions a year coming from superfluous taxation. Not at all. British subjects came as rapidly from 1816 to 1850 under low Democratic taxes as from 1874 to 1888 under high protective taxes. Why, then, do British workmen come to us, and not go to Russia, or France, or Germany, where higher protective tariffs abound.

They come because we dominate over a continent. They come because we have here cheaper and better natural opportunities, by reason of a plenty of cheap and excellent land available for purchase in a healthy climate. Reverse the physical conditions and Americans would become Britons, even if Britons lived under Golden Club free trade.

Canada has protective taxes, but Britons who try Canada swarm to us over the border after awhile. Protective taxes have had no more to do with inviting immigration hither than with the present condition of the weather.—New York Star.
