

**A Wonderful Cave.**

About fifteen miles from the celebrated Modoc lava beds, and within two miles of the road leading from Adin, California, to Linkville, Oregon, is a subterranean cavern which possesses some remarkable characteristics. The opening is described as a slight depression resembling a badger hole and just large enough to admit a man. A short distance inside it opens into a number of large passages, which have been explored several miles with no indication of coming to the end. The atmosphere is found oppressively warm, and no currents of air are found. The only indications of animal life discovered by explorers are the tracks of beasts in the mud, some of which are as large as those of a California lion. One exploring party found a small body of water as clear as crystal about half a mile inside the entrance. Near this evidences of a number of camp fires were seen, showing that the place had been visited by Indians. The roof varies in height and is thickly studded with stalactites.
