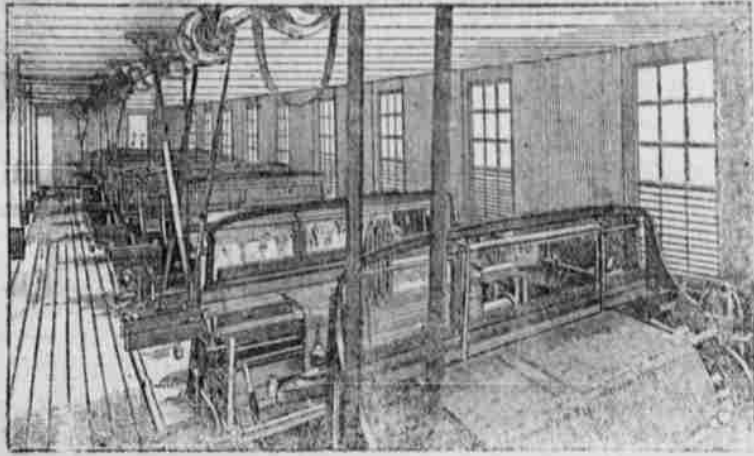

The Canadian Pacific steamer Danube
will bring a cargo of Nuximo coal on her
next trip here. It is not known as yet how
much flour she will carry away, as no con-
tracts have been made. The talk about
China boycotting American flour will not de-
ter merchants here from making their usual
shipments. Very little of the flour sent over
there is consumed in China. Canton takes
a little and Shanghai less. From 60 to 70
per cent of the flour is sent down to the
French settlements in Annam and the Dutch
settlements in the Philippine islands. Some
is used in Japan and some goes to feed the
Russian convicts in Siberia.—Oregonian.
