### THE EUGENE CITY GUARD.

SATURDAY, MAY 21, 1889.

Land in Lane County.

"A. D. H." writing to the Oregonian from Lowell, May 2nd, says:

Lowell is twenty miles, a little south of east from Eugene, on the Oregon Military wagon road, on the middle fork of the Willamette, at the upper end of the Willamette valley. There are settlements for twenty-seven miles above here. A stream runs into the river about twenty-six miles above here called Salt creek. Two trappers, Frank Warner and Charley Tuft, started up that creek about the middle of March, and they went to the summit of the Cascade mountains, where they found but little snow. This creek heads north of Diamond's Peak, and the road runs south of Diamond's Peak. They believe if the road was on the Salt creek pass it could be traveled all winter many winters, as it is nearly a half a mile lower than the existing road.

They also found a horse on the summit of the mountain that belonged to Jas. Sanford. The horse was lost by him and had wintered three winters, and they are satisfied there is no other gap in the Cascade range where stock can winter.

They say this is the finest pass for a rail road in the Cascade mountains; that there will be no need of a tunnel, as it will be a gradual rise on this side for twenty miles, and nearly level on the other, and a great deal nearer than the existing road. There is an abundance of fine timber and plenty of water. At one place the creek has a perpendicular fall of nearly 100 feet.

They found two hot mineral springs, one a very fine one, and they found some rich tracts of fine land. At one place the creek bottom was nearly two miles wide. There is also a good deal of bench land along this creek and fine summer range for stock.

There are two Fall creeks and the Winberry, that are near here, and are not settled upon yet. There is room in this part of the country for many settlers, and land is cheap here, ranging from \$1.25 to \$15 per acre.

### Lost in the Mountains.

On Friday April 26th, Major W. P. Smith, a well known druggist of Halsey, hired a team and started to collect some accounts in the foothills east of that place. He did not return, and fears were entertained for his safety. Parties began to search for him, and he was found in a nearly famished condition, having in some unaccountable manner become lost, and having wandered about without food for a week.

He was quite aged, and his poor sight was doubtless the cause of his becoming lost. He is a brother of Dr. S. H. Smith, of Halsey, and is well known in Linn county. His absence created no little excitement at Halsey, and his friends had feared he would never be found alive.

### Good Work.

During the ten days that the steamer Wm. M. Hoag plied on the river above here, from April 17th to 26th, eight trips were made, some of which were as far up as the "red warehouses," about three miles this side of Harrisburg. She has brought down 1,225 tons of grain, some of the cargoes being the largest ever carried by a boat on the upper Willamette. On Friday evening last she left Corvallis on her way to Portland having come down that day with 150 tons of grain from the Olics war-house, taking on 25 tons here. With this she began running on regular time between here and Portland. There are yet thousands of bushels of grain awaiting shipment at points above here.—Corvallis Gazette.


